

* Water Sales Increased 5.99% to \$6,088,583





- * Cliffs Valley North = 1%


* The Total of all areas cover 18% of Greenville County, S.C.

- * More than 140 Sq. Miles of Service Area
- * More than 500 Miles of Water Mains that are maintained and repaired by Staff Members
- More than 3,800 System Valves and more than 1,000
 System Blow-offs that are maintained regularly, as well as repaired by Staff Members

- * BRRWC maintains a state-of-art Asset Management System and GIS System that stores thousands of inspection records

- * BRRWC staff are on call 24/7 to respond to emergencies








Past System Improvements

- * In the past Chinquapin Road Customers from Bailey Mill Rd to HWY 11 would, during peek usage times, experience decreases in water pressure
- * BRRWC applied for a SC Rural Infrastructure Authority Grant and was awarded a \$500,000 grant
- * The Improvement included:
 - * 17,700 LF of New 10 Inch Water Main along HWY 11
 - * 13 New Fire Hydrants along HWY 11
 - * 28 New System Valves





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Past System Improvements -Chinquapin Road Area

BRRWC Improvement Funds = \$693,305 RIA Grant Received = <u>\$500,000</u>

Total Improvement cost = \$1,193,305






- Replacement of 16,100 LF of 6" PVC water main (1972), with an upgraded new 12" DIP water main & 16 hydrants along HWY 414, from HWY 253 to HWY 101
- Replacement of 6,500 LF of 6" PVC water main (1972), with an upgraded 12" DIP water main & 6 hydrants along Jordan Road, from HWY 101 to the Pleasant Hill Tank








- Replacement of 1,100 LF of 6" PVC water main (1977), with an upgraded 12" DIP water main & 1 hydrant along HWY 25, from the Coon Top Tank to HWY 290
- Replacement of 9,700 LF of 6" PVC water main (1972), with an upgraded 10" DIP water main & 8 hydrants along HWY 290, from the HWY 25 to Henderson Road





- Replacement of 4,350 LF of 6" PVC water main (1972), with an upgraded 8" DIP water main & 4 hydrants along HWY 290, from Henderson Road to Tigerville Road
- * Replacement of Coon Top Tank, a 200,000 ground storage tank (1977), with an upgraded 500,000 gallon elevated storage tank
- Replacement of HWY 414 pump station (1990), with an upgraded pump station to deliver water throughout the system





- * South Carolina Infrastructure Investment Program (SCIIP) is a major, one-time initiative to improve water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure throughout the State of South Carolina
- * The Program utilizes federal funds allocated to the State through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021





- * Blue Ridge Rural Water Company was awarded \$9,118,123 from SCIIP for Water System upgrades and improvements
- * The BRRWC local investment or match is \$3,210,000
- * Total system improvement proposed investment is \$12,328,123
- * This will be the largest one-time investment ever made in the Blue Ridge Water System

Project Timeline

- * Final Design Complete December 2023
- * Permits Acquired February 2024
- * Advertise for Bids March 2024
- * Bid Awards / Work Started June 2024
- * **Completion of Project** January 2026







